Letters and Sounds

Phase 1

Phase 1 is divided into 7 areas:

- Environmental sounds
- Instrumental sounds
- Body percussion
- Rhythm and rhyme
- Alliteration
- Voice Sounds

Oral blending and segmenting



At the end of Phase 1 children should be able to recognize the initial sounds in words.

Letters and Sounds

Phase 2

In Phase 2 children learn the sounds (**phonemes**) that individual letters (**graphemes**) make.

By the end of Phase 2 children should be able to read and write words like these:

dog

duck

nut

pot

mum

pin

sock

cat

buzz

Letters and Sounds

Phase 3

In Phase 3 children learn **digraphs** (a sound/phoneme made of 2 letters) and **trigraphs** (made of 3 letters).

By the end of Phase 3 children should be able to read and write words like these:

coin

moon

goat

yell

light

sheep

chair

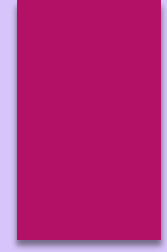

Letters and Sounds

Phase 4



In Phase 4 children learn to read consonant blends (2 consonants at the beginning of end of a word) and words with more than one syllable.

At the end of Phase 4 children should be able to read and write words like:

string

said

branch

comic

crab

one

little

stick

flag

Letter and Sounds

Phase 5

In Phase 5 children learn new graphemes that make the same phoneme as those learned in Phases 2 and 3.

Phase 5 is the longest phase and takes approximately 30 weeks to teach.

By the end of Phase 5 children should be able to read and write words like:

whistle

author

slide

dolphin

game

stone

cube

blue

screw



Letters and Sounds

Phase 6

In this Phase children begin to learn spelling rules.

They learn how to add these endings to words:

-ing
-ed

-est
-er

-ly
-es
